Our ability to efficiently transform donated dollars into compassionate health care for the estimated 10% of our neighbors without health insurance is possible because of the ongoing support of these special friends and colleagues:

Congregation of St. Daniel's Lutheran Church, Robesonia: since helping establish the Clinic as a separate nonprofit in 2002, the congregation continues to provide: clinical and office space, including utilities, at no cost; proceeds from special fundraising efforts; and leadership through its delegate on our Board of Directors.

Mary's Shelter, Reading: provided the renovations of the clinical and office space, including utilities, at no cost for the new satellite location that opened in August 2023.
